NEWSLETTER DEVOTION

Luke 23:42-43

- 42 Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."
- 43 Jesus answered him, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise."

Thy kingdom come, thy will be done. I don't remember the first time I said this part of the Lord's prayer. I don't remember the first time I went to church on Sunday, I don't remember the day when I was baptized into the body of Christ.

But I do remember each of these things in my daily life. I remember the Word of the Lord in my day-to-day activities because His name is on my lips and in my heart. We remember these things because they are important to us. Things that are important become a part of us.

Our faith is a faith of remembrance. We remember the events of Christ's life, His death, and His resurrection. We were not there when these things occurred so the church celebrates these seasons so we can remember what happened and why it's important for us to remember that they happened.

History points to the foundation of our faith. Because it talks about real people and places and times. It's why we remember the creeds, they remind of us of who God has revealed himself to be.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

The "Apostles Creed" has been remembered by all generations of Christians who have believed in Christ's name since the 3rd century. The scriptures point out so many things of Christ and what he has done for us and for our salvation.

During this season of Lent we will be remembering the Word of God and the Work of God in our lives. I started this article pointing to the sinful man on the cross asking Christ to remember him.

It was the most profound statement in his entire life. He knew he needed this man who had done no wrong, because he remembered all the sins he had committed that brought him to the cross in the first place. His only hope was his Savior Jesus Christ. His only hope was Christ because his morality, choices, and actions were literally killing him.

Only Christ's words can give life and Jesus speaks those words to this man. "Today you will be with me in Paradise." A wonderful word of grace, undeserved unmerited just a promise from a God who keeps his promises to those he loves.

So in this season of Lent let's remember Christ and His promises to us.




BLESSING OF NEWLY RENOVATED SACRISTY and PURPLE PARAMENTS

Near the end of last year a mission meeting was held and a number of ORLC congregants attended to hash over what to do with the \$5000 that has been earmarked by the finance committee for various mission organizations. Hank Kuhn, chair of the finance committee and treasurer, Roger Koopman spearheaded this effort.

At the most recent board of Directors meeting it was decided, by a landslide, to donate funds to 4 separate organizations. My nomination was for "LUTHERANS FOR LIFE". There are two other organizations that will be presented to you in later newsletter issues by their champions.

One of my more fervent prayers is, "Who will save the babies?" and LUTHERANS FOR LIFE (incorporated in 1979) is an organization that is attacking that very issue on a daily basis in a nationwide effort in so many ways.

I wasn't aware this organization existed until it was flushed out at the Board of Directors meeting. I'm so happy to know it exists and to be able to champion it for funding from our church.

I'm attaching copied text from their website hoping to promote further exploration by all of you to find out about this life preserving (from conception) and respecting (til natural death) organization.

THEIR PHILOSOPHY:

"LUTHERANS FOR LIFE believes that the Church is compelled by God's Word to speak and act on behalf of those who are vulnerable and defenseless. The crisis of our time is the repudiation of biblical truth manifested in the wanton destruction of innocent human life through legalized abortion-on-demand and the growing threat to the lives of others through legalized assisted suicide and euthanasia. Therefore, we will strive together, as Lutherans For Life, to give witness from a biblical perspective to the Church and society on these and related issues such as chastity, post-abortion healing, and family living."

LUTHERANS FOR LIFE (LFL) is so much more than an organization that produces facts and figures and keeps people informed on the latest life related news and political maneuverings. LFL is about speaking the truth of life—about Bringing Good News to Life. Adam Pajan in Concert

The Hawaii Chapter of the American Guild of Organists will present its Fourteenth Annual Organ Concert on Sunday, March 17 at 2:00 pm at Central Union Church, 1660 South Beretania Street, Honolulu. Featured artist is rising star, Adam Pajan, Instructor of Organ and Shop Technician at the University of Oklahoma's American Organ Institute, where he teaches students in organ performance, organ technology, and church music. He received his DMA in 2014 under John Schwandt following studies at Furman University and Yale University, earning the BM and MM degrees under the tutelage

of Charles Tompkins, Martin Jean, and Thomas Murray respectively.

His performing career has taken him across the United States and to Germany multiple times, playing in the cathedrals of Mainz, Magdeburg, Fulda, and Altenberg and other historical churches; and to England at St. Paul's Cathedral, London, and the Cathedrals of Wells and Bristol. Dr. Pajan has been recognized as the first prize recipient in three national competitions (Albert Schweitzer, Arthur Poister, and Ruth and Clarence Mader) and received the Firmin Swinnen Second Prize in the inaugural Longwood Gardens International Organ Competition in 2013. Adam's accomplishments were recognized in being named one of The Diapason's "20 Under 30" of 2016, an award established to acknowledge individuals who are "setting the pace for the future of the pipe organ, harpsichord, carillon, and church music." His playing has been heard at conventions of the American Institute of Organbuilders, Organ Historical Society, American Guild of Organists, American Liszt Society, and multiple times on American Public Media's Pipedreams.

An enthusiastic church musician, he serves as Organist and Choir Director at St. Mark the Evangelist in Norman, Oklahoma, Artistic Director and Conductor of the Oklahoma Master Chorale, and is a former Dean of the Southern Plains Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Dr. Pajan will feature music from Bach to Schumann in addition to Gershwin, Smyth and Gjeilo. "a rising star definitely worth watching" –Michael Barone, Pipedreams "superb organist" –American Record Guide The concert will be repeated in Hilo on March 21 and in Kula, Maui on March 23.
