Jesus said, "Keep watch for you do not know the day or the hour."

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

When it goes off, there is nothing more I like to do than to silence it by hitting the snooze, which of course only means that I will hear that same annoying sound exactly 9 short minutes later.
